

FIRE ALARMS

ANY CONTRACTOR WORK THAT SETS OFF A FALSE FIRE ALARM WILL RESULT IN A FINE OF \$100 PLUS ALL OTHER EXPENSES THAT MAY RELATE TO THE ALARM. IN ADDITION, THE CONTRACTOR MAY BE DENIED FUTURE ENTRY INTO THE BUILDING.

FALSE ALARMS CAN BE SET OFF BY DUST, DIRT OR SAWDUST IN THE AIR. EXAMPLES INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO DUMPING DUST, DIRT AND/OR SAWDUST INTO THE TRASH CHUTE, DEMOLITION, LEADING IN A FLANGE OR CUTTING A HOT WATER LINE, ANY SANDING IN A UNIT INCLUDING FLOOR OR DRYWALL SANDING AND CUTTING THE UNIT FIRE SPEAKER WIRES.

BEFORE BEGINNING WORK THAT MAY SET OFF THE FIRE ALARM, NOTIFY THE MAINTENANCE SUPERINTENDENT AND THE FRONT DESK SO APPROPRIATE STEPS MAY BE TAKEN TO AVOID A FALSE ALARM.
