Participants will:

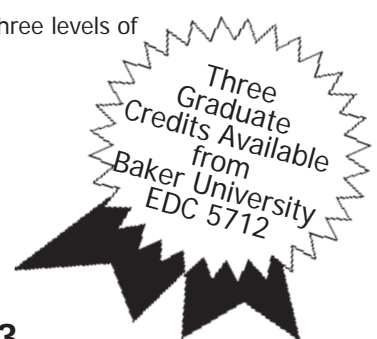
- Develop study guides that accurately represent the curriculum and incorporate multi-sensory reading strategies by pre-teaching vocabulary in syllable patterns.
