

# Using the Orton-Gillingham Approach: Introduction to Basic Multi-Sensory Phonics

## Intended Course Outcomes:

- ◇ Identify six basic syllable types of standard American English.
- ◇ Correctly assist students in understanding and applying syllable division.
- ◇ Correctly teach the concept of schwa.
- ◇ Correctly use four types of multi-sensory drills for instruction, including blending.
- ◇ Understand and interpret to students the 434 generalizations of English.
- ◇ Analyze student handwriting and teach or remediate appropriate student penmanship.
- ◇ Prioritize error patterns for remediation of written expression errors.
- ◇ Correctly utilize student's oral language skills to boost written expression skills.
- ◇ Analyze spelling errors and develop a remedial spelling program for each student.
- ◇ Identify problems of comprehension and three basic levels of comprehension.
- ◇ Administer and interpret four criterion-referenced reading, written expression, and spelling tests in order to understand where to begin the remediation process.

Enrolled teachers will be given required materials valued at \$150: Basic Sounds Practice Pack, Syllable-Plus Board Game, *Syllable Power Books I, II* by Cross and Stoner (Published by Educational Tutorial Consortium, Inc.), *A Guide to Teaching Phonics* by June L. Orton (published by EPS, Cambridge, MA), and Level I Training Manual by Anderson and published by Education Consultants of the Midwest.
