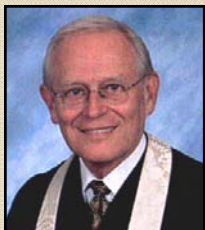
WHAT DOES IT MEAN?



Lent

The period of 40 days prior to Easter, the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the grave. The word "lent" comes from the Latin word for "lengthen," because the days of Lent occur during the springtime of the year, when the daylight hours increase. The period consists of 40 days because the number 40 has special biblical significance: Moses and the people of Israel were in the wilderness for 40 years; Jesus was tempted in the desert for 40 days.

Since the days of the early church, in the decades and centuries after the death and Resurrection of Christ, Christians have regarded the period of Lent as a time for repentance and reflection. It is invariably marked by fasting (going without food and/or water for a period of time), by giving up something during Lent (sweets; the sports page), and by taking on such habits that will increase one's devotion to Christ.

Church Bylaws

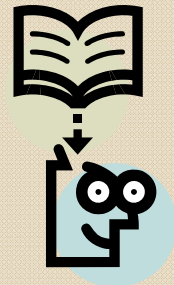
The revision of the Bylaws of El Montecito Presbyterian Church is now complete. The Session voted to approve them and present them at our next Congregational Meeting for a vote to give final approval.

Our bylaws were very outdated and did not address many of the issues of the current day. They also were overly confining in their description of the structure of the boards of the church and of our many diverse ministries.

A Task Force composed of Don Rhodes, Trent Lyon and Harriet Hartt took on the challenge and assisted Executive Director Bill Randolph in this large and complex undertaking. They consulted with Frank Sommerville, LLD, CPA who is a nationally known and well qualified consultant to churches and to the National Association of Church Business Administrators. His guidance was pivotal.

A preliminary copy of the proposed Bylaws was distributed at our last Congregational Meeting. As there have been some additional modifications to

On March 5th through the 7th, the youth will be packing up their snow gear and heading out to Ponderosa Pines for a weekend ski and camping trip. During this weekend trip, the students will have the opportunity to listen to speakers discuss ways youth engage with God, worship with a band, and enjoy the beauty of God's creation on the ski slopes. ONE ON ONE WITH DAVID MCCASLAND

A PIECE OF CAKE

I was sitting with a group of African students during the morning tea break at a small Christian college in Nairobi. Another student joined us, bowed his head and silently gave thanks for his tea and cake.

As he glanced up from his prayer, he noticed one of our maintenance workers who had only a cup of tea and no cake. Room and board provided tea and cake for students, but all staff members paid for their cakes. It cost a shilling and a half (one American dime). The worker had probably decided to skip the cake and save the money for his family.

Without hesitation, the student took his piece of cake and gave it to the worker with a smile. He returned to the table looking a bit embarrassed that someone had seen him do it.

As I witnessed that small but very significant act, a line from a hymn came to mind:

“A heart at leisure from itself, to soothe and sympathize”

The young man who gave away his cake had many reasons to be occupied with his own problems that morning. He had not seen his wife and children in almost two

years—since coming to the school. His home country was 3,000 miles away on the other side of the African continent. It would be another two years before he graduated, and there was no guarantee that he would see his family before then.

He could have been feeling sorry for himself, crying in his teacup, and looking for sympathy from his friends. Instead, he was thinking of others. He had “a heart at leisure from itself, to soothe and sympathize”.

Isn't that what Jesus had? Isn't that what He wants us to have? And isn't that what we long for deep in our hearts?

UPDATE ON OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

MUSIC DIRECTOR MICHAEL EGLIN

The choir enjoys the teaching and musical excellence of Mike every week, plus supportive fellowship and fun social time. Mike's busy life includes much more. He teaches at Santa Barbara City College, and is Assistant Director, and Composer-in-Residence for the 17-year old Quire of Voyces, founded by Nathan Kreitzer, director of vocal activities at the college. The Quire's winter concert premiered Michael's Christmas Vespers, a set of seven movements, the second large-scale work he has composed for the Quire.

His Missa Maria was premiered in 2008. Also presented were three of Michael's Christmas carol settings, Noel nouvelet (2006), Down in Yon Forest (An Appalachian Carol, 2009), and Sweet Babe Wrapt in Twilight Shade (2009). The quire previously performed his Cherry Tree Carol and Judah's Land.

In June the Quire will again travel, this time a 10 day Italian

tour. As the guest choir, they will sing Michael's Missa Maria at High Mass at St. Peter's in Rome, often described as "the greatest of all churches in Christendom," and also present four of Michael's recently composed settings of early American Folk tunes.

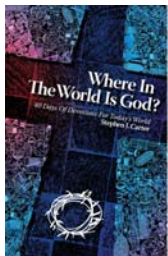
