

## COST OF ATTENDANCE

Estimated Cost of Attendance (COA). The COA is an estimate of school-related expenses that a student can expect to have while enrolled in the dental hygiene program. The COA components are determined by law and include tuition, fees, and textbooks (Direct Costs); room and board, transportation costs, personal expenses, medical expenses, etc. (Indirect Costs). Because certain expenses are estimated figures (based on student surveys and research), a student's actual costs may differ.

### Additional Information Regarding Cost of Attendance

**COA Estimates.** As previously noted, the Cost of Attendance (COA) is an estimate of school-related expenses that a student can expect to have for each academic year. The combination of the direct and indirect costs will be used to determine eligibility for financial aid. A student may receive federal student aid, scholarships, and other aid up to the COA.

**COA Components.** Certain COA components were taken from a Utah College of Dental Hygiene Student Survey and include an annual the Consumer Price Index increase (CPI increase applied to Room and Board, Transportation, and Personal Expenses). Since the COA is based on estimated figures, it may not accurately reflect an individual student's costs. Use these figures as a starting point to estimate what your costs might be.

**Other Important Notes.** It is important to note that costs can change and may be subject to an annual increase. Federal Loan Fees can vary due to Congressional action. Professional licensing fees can vary from state-to-state. Prior to acceptance, there is a \$50 application fee required of all applicants to the program. There is no tuition difference for Resident/Non-resident students.
