History/Mission: IVC of Philadelphia is a private, nonprofit organization that works in partnership with the State Department and the City of Philadelphia to promote democracy and free markets, and to strengthen Philadelphia's international network. IVC is the "door" to the greater Philadelphia community. In recent years, IVC has hosted parliamentarians from five continents, mayors from more than 90 cities around the globe, heads of businesses, universities, hospitals and government agencies from 140 countries. They are a volunteer-based "citizen diplomacy" organization whose network of volunteers was nominated for the 2001 Nobel Peace Prize.
