I'd like to invite you to sit down, pour yourself a coffee, cup of tea, or whatever your beverage of choice is at this particular time because I want to take a minute and tell you a little story. To some, it will sound familiar, to others it won't. But I want to take a moment and share a story with you on this beautiful Spring day in Colorado.

Okay ready? Now, take a look around and take notice of all the things you have in life: health, happiness (I hope), family, etc. Not the material things..but rather the intangibles...look outside - beautiful blue sky, a good day, a Colorful Colorado day. NOW I want you to say Thank Heavens! Thank you God for the blessings I have on this particular day. For just one moment, don't take for granted the wonders of our lives! Acknowledge them...they can be taken from us at anytime. Now I want you to sit back take a deep breath and let me share a story with you...

As you read develop characters in your head..First, you'll need a Mom ... obviously she is a barrel racer and belongs to Mile Hi. She has raced barrels for many, many years..no she's not old - she's a mom of a pre-teen. Mom has always been very VERY competitive but now that her daughter is rodeoing and barrel racing, her desire to compete is second in priority..second only to keeping her daughter going and developing a future Mile Hi Barrel Racer and competitive rodeo athlete.

The next character you'll need to picture is the daughter..a pre-teen approximately 10-12 years old. Only child and very much enjoys the sport of rodeoing and barrel racing. She loves her Mom and Dad too! Like most little girls, she tries hard and is progressing at the sport. Mom and Dad support her so much and they sit on the side lines and want nothing more than for her to do better than they did.isn't that what we all do? We all want better for our children...you can so see it in the eyes of her parents.

Briefly, ALS is a progressive disorder that attacks one's nerves and muscles. It is often times called Lou Gehrig's disease, after the famed New York Yankee slugger. Living with Lou Gehrig's disease is physically difficult-- weakening and paralysis continues to spread throughout the muscles of the body and it eventually affects swallowing, chewing and breathing. It becomes difficult to move around and maintain the lifestyle that one has become accustomed to. To date, there is no cure for ALS.

Our extended family of Mile Hi is a SPECIAL, UNIQUE family. WE care about each other - we may have our differences from time to time - but when things get bad and the chips are down...its family we turn to. And, I am EXTREMELY PROUD of the fact that the Mile Hi Family continues to come thru time after time after time when we have members in need.

This time, we have a Family in need and it absolutely breaks my heart to bring this message to you...I've known Monique for many MANY years and she and McKenzie have been members of Mile Hi since its inception. We provided opportunity to the 1D's in both of our previous events, The Dream Catcher Slot Race focuses on the 3D/4D/5D competitors and we think successfully provides a WINNING OPPORTUNITY TO YOU. That's right, the 1D and 2D barrel racers don't get to participate - except to OWN a slot. Participation is targeted at the 3D/4D/5D barrel racers?This one is ALL ABOUT YOU! Now, I know you're sitting there scratching your head saying WHAT? Are you crazy? How would this ever work? Read on my friend.....

Riders can be recruited more than once and participate in multiple slots but can not exceed a maximum of three entries. The same horse can only be entered once. Final horse and rider information will be posted approximately one week prior to the Dream Catcher Slot Race. Rider or horse substitutions after final field has been posted may be granted ONLY with visible injury or vet statement. No exceptions!

We've limited the number of slots to a total of 35. Once you secure a slot, you have first right of refusal in future years. While anyone can buy a slot, the maximum allowed is 2 slots to the same owner. Mile Hi remains committed to trying new things, new ways! Please mark your calendars The Mile Hi Dream Catcher Slot Race will Be Saturday evening August 21 at Douglas County Fairgrounds in Castle Rock, CO. The Slot Race will be run Saturday Evening 7:00 pm.
