Description: Topic: Learn about how sophisticated internet crime has become and what you need to do to protect yourself from becoming a victim. Security used to be about preventing short-term business disruption. It was about stopping virtual vandalism. The bad guys were mostly ego driven individuals or groups who wanted to make a big splash in the news. In the last couple of years, we have seen a fundamental shift. Malware and other malicious tactics are propagated by sophisticated criminals and networks bent on theft. In 2006 alone IBM's X-Force team identified and analyzed more than 200,000 distinct malware samples. Threat signature-based security tools no longer work. They simply are not fast enough to stem the constant assaults of variants generated by today's sophisticated developers. In

the old days you could repair the damage done by vandalism attacks with time and money. With theft, the damage runs much deeper. Understand the: what is happening, where it is happening, how they are doing it and why you need to do something about it.
