Reflection of Cornell's Life

September 20, 1954 ~ January 21, 2024

Cornell Martin was born on September 20, 1954 in Huntsville, Alabama to the late James and Mary Agnes Martin. Cornell Martin is a husband, father, grandfather, pastor, community organizer, and former owner of Martin's Masonry, Inc. for 40 years. Cornell has served on many boards throughout the city while trying to enhance the City of Huntsville and Madison County community, which led him to start Operation Clean Streets and a Community Neighborhood Watch initiative.

Cornell is the Founder and CEO of 501c3 Non-Profit Organization, Chill Huntsville and Stop the Violence, in Huntsville, Alabama. Also founding Chill Talk Podcast, which is dedicated to those that may be thinking about committing a crime. In addition to being the Founder and CEO of a Non-Profit organization, he hosted a Podcast, Vent-Stration. The Vent-Stration Podcast is a place where one can vent their frustrations by calling in on a live podcast.

Since retiring from the construction industry, Cornell loved the work that he did while serving others and the community. Cornell was the pastor of Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church located in Pulaski, Tennessee. Every Friday, Cornell was found at his Non-Profit Organization, Chill Huntsville and Stop the Violence feeding the homeless and the helpless throughout the City of Huntsville, Alabama.

Cornell was preceded in death by four sisters: Julia Mae Wherry, Eleanor Watkins, Ormelia Boone, Glenease Strong, and Sue Berta Martin; three brothers: Homer L. Martin, Joe D. Martin, Johnnie Martin, and Willie J. Martin ("Bubba"); two sons: Lamarin Ford, Sr. and Ricky Maurice Fletcher.

Cornell accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior in March of 1979 at Union Chapel M.B. Church. Just four short months later, he preached his first sermon in July of 1979.

Cornell loved the Lord, his friends, classmates, and his family. He could be found eating in the best restaurants in the city, at home catching up on his favorite TV shows, and traveling the country with the 6 Club. Out of all of his many traveling ventures, nothing compared to traveling to Chicago, IL to visit his favorite cousins, Donald and Sabrina Moore. He was also a member of the Chicago Idlewilder's, Inc.

Pastor Cornell leaves his legacy of love to be cherished by his devoted wife of 30 years, First Lady Norma Martin, daughter, Andrea Martin, son, James Vinson; his niece, who he affectionately called his daughter, Aretha McNealey; bonus sons: Demond, Travis, Dennis, and Ishmael; brothers and sisters: Charlie (Mae) Martin, Ronnie (Laura) Martin, James (Catherine) Hambrick, Rosie Pickett, and Martha Leslie; daughter inlaw, Keisha Ford; mother-in-law, Mabel Linza White; brothers and sisters in love: Barbara (Gene) Jackson, Eddie (Sandra) Woods, Teresa White, Nathan White, and Melissa Hester, and a host of grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, aunts, uncles, other relatives and dear friends.


